

## Report on the participation of the IAG Regional Conference on Geomorphology

The post-conference field trip to the Altai Mountains of Russia has been very exciting and even adventurous to some degree, typically when riding in some Russian 4-wheel drivers to cross rough landscapes. We have seen very beautiful landscapes, especially the snowy top of the Altai Mountains, river valleys, terraces and palaeo-lakes. Their interpretation of the formation of mega-bars, palaeo-shorelines, gravel bars is site-based and so is very convincing. It is also very clear that they have done very hard work over the years in the rather remote area. We really need to learn from them on both scientific reasoning and field investigation.

Hence, I would like to say thanks to IAG and also the conference organizers who have done very hard work so as to make the conference very successful and the field trip very memorable.
